

**Thanks so much for purchasing my presets!** In this quick guide I'll show you the easy step-by-step process for downloading the presets, and adding them to your Lightroom Mobile App. To get started make sure you have Lightroom Mobile and the Files app installed on your phone. This tutorial shows the process on iOS, however, the process on Android will be almost identical. Here we go!





When you get the email with the link to download it will look like this. Tap on the link under "digital downloads" to get started!



Then tap on "open in" and when the menu pops up with options, scroll down to select "add to files" if you don't see this option, you may need to tap "edit actions" to find it and add it to your list of options.



Select "on my iPhone" and choose which folder you'd like to save your presets in. Then, you'll open up your Files app, and navigate to the folder you selected.



First you'll see the zip file on its own - tap it to "unpack" it. Then, you'll see the folder with the presets inside. Tap to open the folder.


Here are the preset files! Start by tapping on one of them to open it.


It will look like a blank file - don't worry, that's how it's supposed to look. Next, tap on the "share" button in the bottom left so you can add the image to your camera roll.

Tap on "save image" - then repeat this with all the presets.


Once you've saved all of the DNG files to your camera roll, open up the Lightroom Mobile app.




Tap on the blue button in the bottom right to import photos.




Select "from camera roll"




Select all the blank boxes with "DNG" in the top right corner. These are the preset files.




You'll notice now that the DNG files are actually images, they are labelled with their preset title as well.



Tap on one to open it. Then tap the three dots, and select "create preset"



Add the title of the preset, add it to a group if you'd like, and you're ready to go!



Once you have all of the presets saved to your Lightroom app, anytime you import a new photo, all you need to do to edit it with the preset is slide along the options at the bottom until you find “presets” and then tap to open the preset menu. Choose the “ks presets 2020” folder, and then choose whichever preset you’d like to use. And you’re done!
